# **Boston Art & Music Soul Festival**

Come put the "soul" into solstice this month: On June 22, the Boston Art & Music Soul Festival returns for its second celebration of community work and culture, with creative people of color in the spotlight. "[The festival] was created to acknowledge the impact and influence of black artistry in the city, nation, and world," says founder, curator, and executive director Catherine Morris.

This year's acts include headliner Eric Roberson, Ashley-Rose, and the Tee-Tones. Organizers also promise activities for the whole family: While adults take in a live graffiti-art exhibition, kids are welcome at dance lessons taught by members of the Racines Black Dance Festival. "By attending," Morris explains, "you join a movement that supports creative talent in Boston and brings us closer to being seen as a cultural destination." 
